# Ambulance - Garth Kagels

He asked if a contractor determines who does work in the County. Deckard had requested to update the County corner stone markers. He also stated that the realtors drawing was changed in regards to the roads on Grubb Lane and Roger asked the county to take the road over. He asked why unelected official were making the rules. Roger Azar said that the County needs to do the section corners. The County will bid out the work when a decision has been made to start the process.

Clint also had an email from Rod Bannon and asked why he is requesting to get people fired in the Courthouse.
