Ordinance 2021-10 - Vacating Certain Platted but Undeveloped/Unused Alley & Streets in the Unincorporated Town of Rob Roy

This will be the first reading of Ordinance 2021-10 There will be a public hearing at the $1^{\rm st}$ meeting in October.

Town of Veedersburg - Tim Shumaker

The Town of Veedersburg wants to purchase 5-10 acres of land by the new Jail to put in a Solar Farm. This section of land is not part of the landfill. They will get a credit from IMPA if they erect a solar farm. Tim will be speaking to Veedersburg about a price and letting them know that the Commissioners will take it into consideration.

SEALED BIDS – Reassessment for the Assessor

Two bids were received. One from Tyler Technologies in the amount of \$414,000 and Advaloreum Solutions in the amount of \$344,640. The commissioners will take the bids under advisement.

PAWS & CLAWS AGREEMENT

A motion was made by Tim Shumaker and seconded by Andrew Hall to approve the agreement with Paws & Claws giving Andrew authorization to make minor final changes as needed.

BRENT BAUERBAND - Economic Development (WHIN)

Six Counties have come together including Fountain County. They are looking to receive a 50-million-dollar grant. They need matching funds from each county. The Community Foundation is awarding \$500,000. Another \$200,000 for 2 years is needed to complete the project. This will complete the 90-mile trail starting from Logansport, IN going to 234 in southern Fountain County. They have to have the READI grant submitted by September 30. The Commissioners will consult with the Council on Monday and make a decision on where to take the funds from.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Sheriff - Andrew Krout

The Lexipol program redoes policies for the Sheriff's department. It is very detailed and the best they have ever had. The policies won't be updated until March. They also partner with EMC and will receive a discount on insurance.

They currently have 70 inmates. The jail population is down due to the quarantining of inmates.

Ambulance – Garth Kagels

An EMT resigned and they need to fill that position. It is a full-time position. He expecting to have the new truck by September 23rd.

The ceiling in the bay is still a need because of the bird situation. A cathedral style or straight across would be best.

The Commissioners would like to have a revised quote for the parking lot to be done.

STAT Flight – 80-90 runs a year for Fountain County. It will be discussed at the Council meeting on Monday and a representative from STAT Flight will be there as well.

Highway - Rusty Peevler

The Rob Roy Bridge is completed and open.

There is a sink hole in Stringtown and it is growing. They have closed the street. There are a lot of mines under the town. They are afraid if they start digging, that it will be a mine shaft and they will lose equipment or worse. An Engineer is needed to determine how to proceed. Andrew Hall will call Roger Azar.

They need 2 more quotes for the exhaust system to be put in at the Highway Department. Diesel fumes are still going everywhere throughout the building. Andrew will be getting these as well.

Assessor - Sandy Whitaker

The server is getting close to full and she believes there is a need for a new one. Brad Keller was also at the meeting and assured the Commissioners that there was plenty of room and that it would not crash. The new server is already upstairs, but he hasn't fully transferred over everything because of lack of cooler temperatures in the room it is stored in.

A new split AC unit will be necessary to make the room fully functional to house the servers.

A motion was made by Tim Shumaker and seconded by Andrew Hall to do an additional appropriation in the amount of \$15,000 to

purchase and install a split unit. This is contingent on the Council approving which fund to use.

Health - Erich Haley

The junkyard on 234 has asked for an extension until mid-September. He was in an accident and is shorthanded. The Health Department granted the extension.

EMA- Joe Whitaker

There are approximately 120 responders working the Luke Bryan concert. This includes Sheriff, City, EMS etc. Four counties are helping. He would like to see an Ordinance so that the proper procedures are taken when there is an event like this taking place in our county.

Clerk - Paula Copenhaver

She informed the Commissioners that over 38 States have adopted a Constitutional Rights Sanctuary Ordinance. She urges the Commissioners to do a similar act. She printed out an example of one that another County is using. The Commissioners will review it for consideration.
